

5 TIPS FOR PUBLISHING WHILE WORKING ON YOUR PH.D. THESIS!

START GETTING INVOLVED IN YOUR ACADEMIC COMMUNITY!

Make strong connections with people in your field as they will share important information with you. Be collegial and look out for each for another in your cohort.



IT'S OK TO STICK WITH WHAT YOU KNOW!



Be smart about how you work. You don't necessarily have to think outside of the box, per se, but you also don't want to double-dip. In other words, utilize the topics, approaches, themes of what you're currently working on and apply them in different ways.

HIT THAT SUBMIT BUTTON!

Don't hesitate to submit an abstract or a full paper because you're afraid that it's not good enough or that it'll be rejected. Mitigate these issues by:

- Asking your supervisor to read a draft of your work
- Asking colleagues to read a draft of your work
- Hiring a professional editor



If your abstract or paper gets "rejected," find another venue to publish it in. It is NOT the end of the world.

REVISIONS AREN'T A BAD THING!



Learn how to handle criticism. Take your editors' comments seriously, but at the same time, be firm about what you don't want to change (especially if, it's central to your argument).

MARK YOUR CALENDARS WITH IMPORTANT DEADLINES

Show off your professionalism by sticking to the deadlines proposed by the editor(s). Be professional in all aspects of your email communication with your editor(s).
